Ridley Park Manager Retires



Roger McChesney, Ridley Creek State Park Superintendent, now retired

Roger McChesney, Superintendent/Manager of Ridley Creek State Park for the past 11 years, retired in April 2011. Roger had been the Park Manager since May 2000. During his tenure many improvements and changes have occurred in the park: The Friends volunteer group was organized, the park office at Hunting Hill Mansion was totally refurbished, new hiking trails were opened, picnic facilities were expanded, the wedding program was established, the horse stables were extended, and the park's infrastructure was improved.

Our group, the Friends of Ridley Creek State Park, owes its existence to the vision of Roger McChesney, and for this we are most grateful. It was at his insistence, and

Coming in Fall 2011: Talk on Herbal Medicine

If you are interested in herbs, look for this special event scheduled for Sunday, November 6.

Author and food historian William Woys Weaver will be speaking at the Mansion about his 2001 publication, Sauer's Herbal Cures, America's First Book of Botanic Healing (published by Routledge). This event is sponsored jointly by the Friends of Ridley Creek State Park and the Eastern Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Herbalists Guild.

Mr. Weaver resides in Devon and specializes in the history of American cuisine and foodways. He is a three-time winner of the Julia Child Cookbook Award. His books include *Heirloom Vegetable Gardening, Pennsylvania Dutch Coun-*

try Cooking, and Sauerkraut Yankees. He is well known as an heirloom gardener and seed saver.

Sauer's Herbal Cures is a translation of the text from Pennsylvania Dutch, originally assembled by Pennsylvania apothecary and printer Christopher Sauer (1721-1784). Sauer grew up in the German immigrant community and his German was riddled with syntax and terminology borrowed from colonial English. As a skilled ethnobotanist, Mr. Weaver added footnotes and edited segments to the translation to clarify historical details for the reader.

There will be a nominal charge for this event. More details will be on our website and in our next newsletter.

against much negative advice, that the Friends of Ridley Creek State Park became the first volunteer Friends group organized under Pennsylvania Parks and Forestry Foundation in the Commonwealth. Pennsylvania state parks are now entitled to have one Friends group, which is the official volunteer organization for each park. Most Friends groups are organized under Pennsylvania Parks and For-Foundation

(PPFF) which provides their 501(c)3 charitable status and many support systems for the Friends chapters.

Roger directed the revitalization of the Hunting Hill Mansion, which was expanded from the original farmhouse by the Jeffords family in 1915. The roof was replaced using the original type of roof, cedar shingles. Asbestos was removed and the entire HVAC system was replaced. The ballroom was repaired and upgraded and a bridal room was created. These improvements and many others led to the expansion of the popular wedding program, which creates a positive revenue stream for the state's parks program.

With the encouragement of Roger McChesney, our Friends group has been able to make many contributions to the park, including trail maintenance, a laptop computer used in the park's educational programs, an automatic electronic defibrillator (AED), picnic tables, playground equipment, and

other needed tangibles not included in the Commonwealth's budget. The Friends take care of all maintenance of the very popular trail system that encompasses over 10 miles.

The equestrian program - Hidden Valley Farms - has grown and improved under Roger's direction in the past 10 years. Picnic facilities have expanded with the addition of two pavilions, resulting in increased revenue to the state. The park's infrastructure has been maintained and expanded despite numerous budget contractions.

Roger left with mixed feel-

ings. During his time here he grew fond of the park and the public who enjoyed it. He valued and appreciated working with his staff and felt a deep sense of pride in his accomplishments. On the other hand, he left looking forward to his new life as a gentleman farmer in western Pennsylvania.

Roger Mc Chesney will be greatly missed by the Friends of Ridley Creek State Park and especially the Board of the Friends who have worked closely with him. He always had time to listen to our requests and give them serious consideration. In his gentle sage way he would give advice and guidance rather than issuing directives or edicts. His limitless body of knowledge will be hard to replace. We have all been enriched and benefited from Roger's tenure in Ridley Creek State Park!
